MUCH PRAYER, MUCH POWER LITTLE PRAYER, LITTLE POWER NO PRAYER, NO POWER!

This is a sermon title that a church was advertising for their Sunday Service. We appreciate your constant and powerful prayers on behalf of our country. Honduras went to elections on Sunday November 29th and elected a new president. Porfirio Lobo on the National party has officially been appointed president. The past elections were the most voted elections in Honduras' history. Representatives of the International Community commended the Hondurans for the peaceful environment and the civic celebration that the election day became. .

We are still waiting on the decision of the congress on ex-president Zelaya. The congress voted yesterday NOT to restore him in power as he demands, but he is still staying in the consulate of Brazil in Tegucigalpa, and will eventually have to move on either to submit to judicial trial for the accusations of corruption, drug trafficking and the attempt to change the constitution, or request exile in Brazil, Venezuela or any other country with similar political ideas to those he pursued.

The International Community was pleased with the elections. They had announced that they will suspend all sanctions that were imposed on the country after a new president was democratically elected.

We are so thankful and relieved to hear that the conflict is coming to an end! The political unrest greatly affected the Honduran economy. International financial help and loans were suspended. Much state money was used to pay for the election that Manuel Zelaya wanted to do on June 28th, some more was used to mobilize the army and police to protect the citizens of Honduras through the conflict. The unemployment rate grew higher due to the conflict and the international recession as a whole. As of Mision Caribe and other ministries in Honduras, we are thankful that the church continued to grow, it remained steadfast and united in prayer through the entire situation. We learned that politics might be at times a significant cause of division, but not one that is strong enough to keep the saints from being loyal to their God and spiritual family.

We cannot wait to see the great things that God is going to do in the lives of his church in the next month and New Year.

We pray that his kingdom will continue to grow, that more servants will be called, that more Christians will answer "send me" and that in the process we might enjoy the great privilege of meeting together, if not in the same physical space, in the one, universal, solely worthy Mission.

Baptisms

There is no other church working in the area, not even the Catholic church (most predominant religion in Honduras) is there' Some activities held so far; 42 people attended the first service, a soccer tournament, and a wedding! 4 people have rededicated their lives to Jesus and 1 was baptized.
